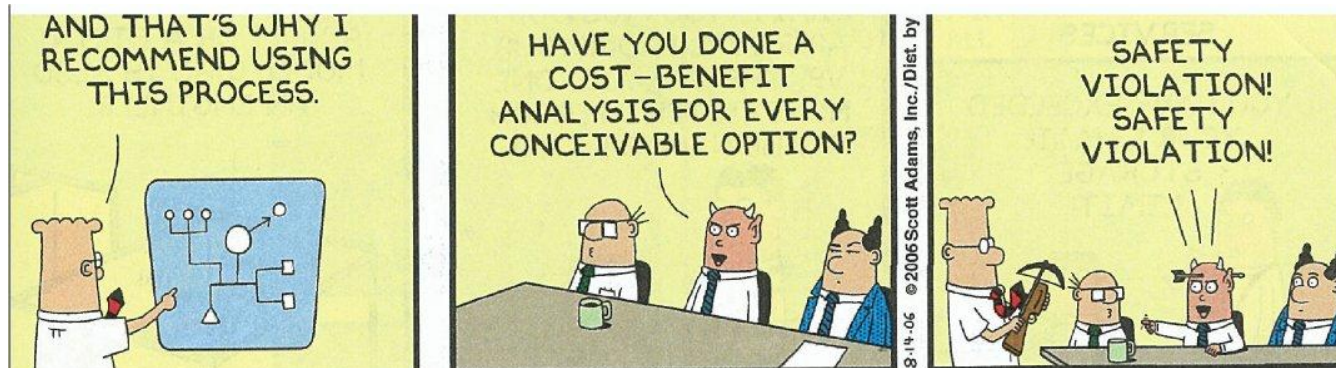
Triennial Self-Evaluation and Strategic Plan

- Consider opportunities for special events that focus on transportation economics; assign a task force to plan and carry out each special event

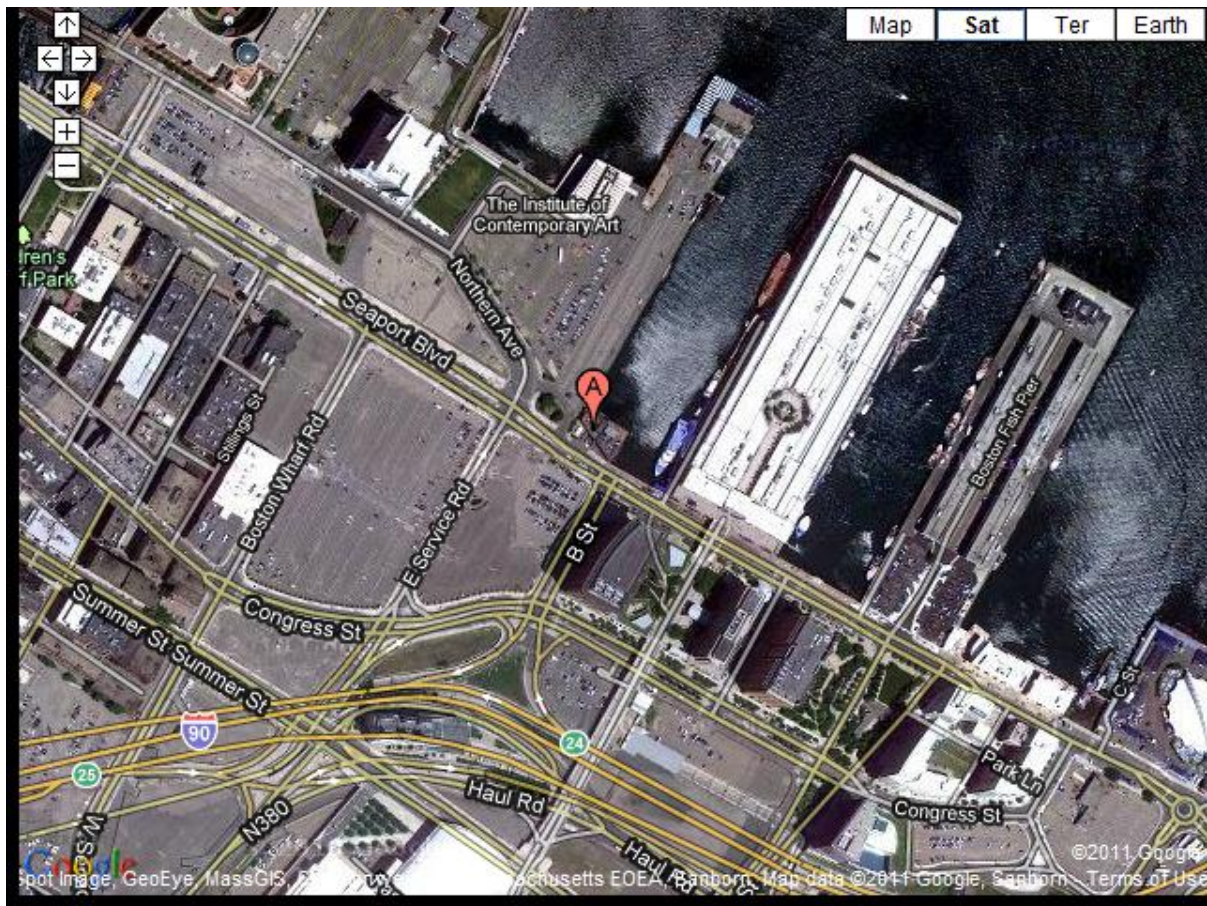
